Read and Enjoy every moment of our journey in this first quadrimester!






Environment Revolution begins with Greening the motherland.


Geometrical City


Types Of Drainage Patterns

The learners’ skills have been stimulated over the months as they investigated and integrated other subjects into their hands-on learning experience based on various topics ranging from Vaccines to Germination. These inquiry projects have encouraged the learners to ask questions, gather and analyze sources and creatively synthesize their observations. The experiential learning through projects has indeed given the learners a great platform to present their research work with enthusiasm and confidence.

Grade I STAYING ALIVE



NATURE WALK


